

## Welcoming and Following up with Visitors!

Organize a welcoming process and train members of your congregation to partner in welcoming visitors! You can set up a rather simple yet effective method for welcoming visitors that come to your church with a little preparation and training.

- ✓ INITIAL VISIT: Give the visitor a warm welcome and a brochure or information packet which can be handed to first time visitors as they arrive. Be sure to include information that will allow the new person get involved in your church activities, a list of who to call if they have questions, a list of small groups that they can get involved with AND some information for the children who visit (see the archives of the Welcoming Community newsletter to get some ideas and templates for this!) You can go to the Welcoming Community newsletter to find a great inexpensive gift item to give to families with young children.
- ✓ Ask the visitor to complete a visitor form that, as a minimum, tells you their name, address, phone, address and number and ages of children.
- ✓ DAY AFTER VISIT: Send a short note which thanks the visitor for attending AND include an invitation to some of the weekly events that happen at your church. Give the family the names and phone numbers of one or two other members who have kids of similar ages or who live in the same neighborhood, etc so the visiting family has the option of calling someone if they are interested. If the visitor is clearly from another community or committed to another congregation, discontinue follow up at this point.
- ✓ BY WED OR THURSDAY AFTER THE VISIT: Have someone from your congregation or the Pastor give the family a short phone call to again thank them for their visit, to see if they have any questions about the congregation AND to offer them the gift of an email devotional which helps them incorporate their faith into the workplace. (Download the customizable pdf form from Welcoming Community to send to your visitors.) This devotional is available for free because it is sponsored by the EXODUS Network. If the family is new to the community and they have children, encourage other members with children of the same age to invite the children over for a play date.

- ON THE 2<sup>nd</sup> OR 3<sup>rd</sup> VISIT: Offer to give the visitors a personal tour of the church building. Be sure to have some members of your congregation approach the visitors, engage them in conversation, introduce them to others and give personal invitations to mid week event or activities. Send a notice to the SS teachers/youth leaders or activity leaders that would have them in their class. Encourage the leaders to give a call or send a note to the person eligible for their class/activity.
- ON THE 4<sup>th</sup> VISIT: Give them a picture directory, arrange for them to have a mailbox, invite them to attend a no-obligation membership class. If the family has young children, offer the family a night of free childcare.
- DURING THE 2<sup>nd</sup> MONTH: Have at least one family invite the visitors to their home or a restaurant for a shared meal. Consider matching up families who are new to the community with "Surrogate Grandparents".
- ✓ DURING THE 3<sup>rd</sup> MONTH: If the visitor has not yet joined a small group, have the coordinator of small groups contact the visitor to offer their assistance in being involved. Be sure to include the children in small groups appropriate for them as well.

## Encourage your leadership team to pray about how God might want to do something new with your welcoming plans and strategies!
